Use **ONLY** the images provided for Contest 23 to create the logo. **NO OTHER IMAGES MAY BE USED**, but you may manipulate or edit the images. Entries that use images or material other than what JEA provides will be disqualified.

Use any styles, fonts and sizes that you deem appropriate.

Use correct spelling and AP style on any text you use.
